A little information about your stay at Lundsgaard

Every morning in the summer period (from weeks 27 to 35) breakfast is served on the terrace between 8.00 and 9.00. (Please place your order the previous evening).

During the rest of the year you can order a breakfast tray, which will be placed, outside your room (at a pre-arranged time).

The garden by the play area and the wood are all available for guests to use. The same applies to the terrace behind the party room.

Rubbish bins are situated at the bottom of the parking area to the left.

We would like to point out that Lundsgaard is a smoke free centre and that therefore you may only smoke outside.

Experience Faaborg on an evening tour through the streets with one of the town's night watchmen. The tour starts from Faaborg clock tower at 9 pm.

Five days of history:

The Bronze Age and more in south west Funen:

Day 1

One of the richest Bronze Age settlements, not just in Funen, but in Denmark, used to be in the area around **Voltofte**, between Haarby and Assens, where today there is a residential neighbourhood. Visit Voldtofte, Lusehøj and Drengenhøj. On the way there from Horne you drive through Jordløse where Gisselhøj is.

(Among other attractions in this area to be mentioned are Helnæs, Saltofte beach, the Skoda museum and Assens)

Day 2

At **Svanninge Bakker** lies Skerningehøj - a Stone Age passage grave. It was constructed around 3,200 BC and is extremely well preserved.

(other attractions in the Svanninge Bakker area worth mentioning are the large natural play area (naturlegeplads) a must for both big and small children. There is also the opportunity for a guided tour of the area every Thursday in July until the middle of August from 9.45 to 12.15..The price is 40 kroner. Booking at Faaborg Tourist Information. Also in the area is the Archipelago Trail, Trende Mill together with one of Funen's oldest inhabited houses)

Day 3

Just off the road from Faaborg to Svendborg you'll find Alléskoven and Pipstorn Woods with burial mounds from both the Stone and Bronze Ages spread through the woodland. On the way back to Faaborg why not look in at Kaleko Mill, which is Denmark's oldest functioning mill and still stands in its own original setting. You have the opportunity of buying a drink there and are most welcome to bring your own food.

(other attractions in the area are Katterød farm shop, Nab beach, Holstens House and flower garden)

Day 4

Try the "The Fairytale Trail – Andersen was here" round Faaborg, places like Den Voigstke Gaard in the middle of Faaborg and Holstenshus castle park.

(another attraction on offer in the area is Brehetrolleborg Castle, where there is a fantastic rhododendron wood, which just has to be experienced when in bloom)

Day 5

Spend a day in the town of Faaborg. Visit Faaborg museum, the old prison, the clock tower and Den Gamle Gaard museum. Visit Horne church – it is Funen's only round church. It was originally built as a fortress. The buildings on either side are later additions.

One evening:

Five days of museums and galleries:

Day 1

Take a tour of **Faaborg's** museums and galleries. Faaborg Art Museum has a collection mainly of Funen artists though it also has temporary exhibitions. Look out for Bøjestrædet, a side street just off the pedestrian area, where both jewellery and ceramics are for sale. Down near the harbour, on the corner of Strandgade and Christian IX Vej you can find, side by side, both Kunsthjørnet (The Art Corner) and Peter Sekjær. Kunsthjørnet offers a collection of different artists' ceramics, glass and paintings. Peter Sekjær is a studio shop where Peter sells his own work, both ceramic figures and drawings.

Day 2

A few kilometres from Faaborg on the way to Svendborg is Katterød Kunsthåndværk, a large 600 square metre centre full of hand crafted products. Here, about 75 artists and craftspeople exhibit and sell their work. Driving further on to Svendborg try Galleri Flintholm in the village of Hundstrup, with changing exhibitions the whole year round. It's an incredible, fine building with a fantastic atmosphere. A little further on lies Vester Skerninge Kro, which is one of Denmark's oldest inns. It's worth a visit for lunch, just cake and a coffee, or for an evening meal.

Day 3

A visit to **Odense** has to be experienced. There are various sights to choose from. In particular, Brandts where among others, Queen Margrethe has exhibited, Odense City Museum, Den Fynske Landsby and Funen's Art museum are all worth a visit.

Day 4

Egeskov Castle is a venue that offers a veteran car museum, a dolls house museum, Falck auto museum and the most fantastic castle garden, which can be enjoyed for hours on end. There is also a huge play area. There are opportunities to buy food and drink and to eat both indoors and out, but of course you can always bring a packed lunch.

Day 5

On a trip to **Svendborg** you can visit Naturama or Valdemar Castle on Tåsinge which is on the way to Langeland. Furthermore, Svendborg offers a delightful shopping experience.

Five days of relaxation and wellbeing in south Funen

Day 1

Bøjden Beach is situated next to the ferry terminal. It's the best beach in Horneland. Take a picnic basket from Bøjden Kro, order it through us or ring the inn directly. Please order the day before.

Day 2

Spend a day in **Faaborg**. On Saturdays in August there is jazz in the Square (Torvet) There are lots of friendly cafés and eating places. Afterwards you could drive to Strandlyst flower garden out at Nab, which is open everyday from 9 am until 6 pm from the 5th May until the 1st October.

Day 3

If you drive from Horne to Assens you can visit **Saltofte**. This is a fantastic beach, from which you could make a delightful tour of the area. If you're tired of lying on the beach, Assens is only 2 kilometres away, offering rich shopping opportunities.

Day 4

A day in **Svendborg** is not to be missed. Visit Beauty Secrets and have a facial with for example Ole Henriksen's products or perhaps the tinting of eyelashes or eyebrows. We have an agreement with them, which entitles you to a 10% reduction per treatment . And when you are in Svendborg there are lots of delightful shops and cafés to suit every taste. For example, try the restaurant boat with its excellent fish menu and lovely view over Svenborg Sound.

Day 5

Bjørnø is one of the smallest islands in the south Funen archipelago. You can stroll round its coastline in a couple of hours. The trip offers flat tidal meadows with birdlife and high cliffs and beautiful views of the mainland. There are hedges and stone walls and in the little village, beautiful old half timbered courtyards. A vast number of ducks and other waterfowl breed on the tidal reaches and also in the marsh in the middle of the island. It takes just half an hour to travel there by ferry but you can't take your vehicle.

Five days' activity holiday in south Funen

Day 1

At 66 Sinebjergvej you can hire a dinghy for three people with a 5 hp motor, including lifejackets, oars and anchor. The cost is 200,00 kroner for 4 hours, 300,00 kroner a day and 1000,00 kroner a week. You can also hire a dinghy for four people with a 15 hp motor, including lifejackets, oars and anchor. The cost is 300,00 kroner for 4 hours, 400,00 kroner a day and 1800,00 kroner a week. Petrol can be bought from the owner (at current prices).

Furthermore, you could also hire a sea kayak, including life jacket and double paddle, the cost is 80,00 kroner for 2 hours, 120,00 kroner for 4 hours, 150,00 kroner a day and 800,00 kroner a week.

Day 2

Østrup Iceland Ponies offer you a riding experience in beautiful natural surroundings about 10 kilometres north of Faaborg. A day's pony trekking costs from 500,00 to 700,00 kroner. You can book on Thursday and Friday afternoons. Contact Dorte Mehr, Østrup 32, 5600 Faaborg. Telephone 6268 2808.

Ride beautiful Oldenburg horses. An hour's trip for 120,00 kroner. Two hours for 200,00 kroner. Kontakt Jannick Nøddekær, Strandby Skov 3, 5683 Haarby. Telephone 6473 2870.

Day 3

The region offers two types of golf courses. **Faaborg Golf Course** is situated in the scenic Svanninge Bakker area, with a magnificent view over the archipelago. The course has 18 holes and is in use the whole year round.

Ringe Golf Course is a 9 hole "Pay and Play" setup and is close to Ringe town. Membership is not required to play on these courses. Equipment can be hired.

Day 4

A day of cycling around Horne and Faaborg. Bicycles can be hired from Faaborg Tourist Information.

Day 5

Take a day out on the beach, for example **Bojden Beach**, or if the weather isn't good go indoors to **Faaborg Svømmehal** which offers a 34 degrees warm water pool with massage jets , a 27 degrees, 25 metre pool with 6 lanes, together with a play pool, 1 and 3 metre diving boards and a 30 metre water slide. Also sauna, steam baths, cold water tubs, a super modern solarium and a cosy café.

Five days for children

Day 1

The **Naturlegeplads**, a woodland play area with "Troideland, " Troll Land, is situated in a former gravel pit. It's divided into different 'pockets'. In the biggest is the play area for 7 –12 year olds. Here there is a rain shelter with tables and benches and space for about 50 people. In the smallest 'pocket' is "Alfeland" Elf Land, a play area for 2 – 6 year olds. You can find fireplaces in both these play areas, but you need to bring your own wood. A little to one side and down a steep slope is "Huleland", Hole Land, where children can build their own shelters.

Day 2

Egeskov Castle, is one of Denmark's most beautiful castles and is open to the public. Here there are lots of experiences for both big and little children. They have a huge play area and there are opportunities to buy food or take a lunch pack with you. Pick up a brochure from reception.

Day 3

Odense Zoo is one of Denmark's best zoological gardens. Pick up a brochure from reception.

Day 4

Bøjden Beach is the best bathing beach in the vicinity of Horne. It's situated to the left of the ferry terminal and has a good sandy beach. Call in to Bøjden Kro and take a picnic basket with you. It can be ordered through us the day before, or of course you can order it yourself.

Day 5

Legoland needs no introduction. It's approximately a 90 minute drive from Lundsgaard.

Five days in the countryside

Day 1 (Thursdays)

Knold. A guided tour, Learn about the cliffs' geological strata, plant life and more. Thursdays in July until the middle of August from 13.45 to 16.30. The cost is 40,00 kroner. Book through Faaborg Tourist Information.

Day 2

Bøjden Nor is one of the Bird Protection Foundation's sanctuaries. The whole of Bøjden Nor's 118 hectares is a conservation area. From the observation tower you can experience bird life a few metres away. Take a picnic basket from Bøjden Kro, order it through us or ring the inn directly. Please order the day before.

Day 3 (Thursdays)

Funen's Alps. An exciting and active guided tour. Hear about the region's geology, landscape and more. Thursdays in July until the middle of August from 9.45 to 12.15. The cost is 40,00 kroner. Booking can be made through Faaborg Tourist Information.

Svaninge Bjerge, situated in the Svaninge Hills is accessible to the public, was once privately owned and is a good 46 square kilometres. The area includes Lerberg which at 126 metres is one of Funen's highest points.

Day 4

A day on two islands Lyø and Avernakø. Get in touch with us about ordering a picnic basket for Lyø. Avernakø lies in the south Funen archipelago. The island is very long and was originally two islands, Avernakø and Korshavn. They are now joined by a causeway. Ferries that sail to Avernakø also serve Lyø. They sail from Faaborg harbour the direct trip takes 30 minutes. To Lyø the journey lasts 1 hour 10 minutes. You may take your vehicle on board. The ferry operates throughout the day and the last sailing from Avernakø leaves at 21.00.

Day 5

Arreskov Sø is Funen's biggest lake. The lake is encircled by woodland and marshy areas with reeds. Arreskov Lake has been excavated out of a glacier that left behind material in Funen's alps. The lake is 317 hectares big and at it's deepest 3.7 metres. A spring rises from the bottom and approximately 15% of the lake's running water is spring water.

Sollerup Skov is a wood that lies in a hilly landscape with a variety of both new and old conifer and deciduous trees. The running brook has created a fascinating environment at Helvedeshule.

Five evenings eating out

Evening 1

Il Corvo is situated at Faaborg's harbour. It offers an Italian menu. Main courses start from 169,00 pasta from 95 kroner.

Evening 2

Det Hvide Pakhus is in Faaborg's harbour area. Main courses start from 176,00 to 215,00 kroner. Children's main course costs 78,00 kroner.

Evening 3

Faaborg Røgeri Café is also situated in Faaborg's harbour area and serves fish of every description. They have cold and warm smoked dishes as well as unsmoked. Prices range from 22,00 to 59,00 kroner.

Evening 4

Falsled Kro or Steensgaards Herrepension. If you'd like to try places that are a little more expensive, these are to be recommended. Falsled Kro is one of Denmark's most well known restaurants. Steensgaards Herrepension in Millinge is also a fantastic eating place, and is a little cheaper than Falsled Kro. Both places are also worth visiting for lunch or perhaps just for coffee and cake.

Evening 5

Go down to the harbour in Faaborg or out to Bøjden. Buy fresh fish from the fishermen when they come home in the morning and prepare it yourself back in the courtyard. If you want an organic accompaniment we recommend you shop at Super Brugsen in Faaborg who stock a wide range of organic products.

Alternatively if you want a really easy evening, we can recommend Horne Pizza. They produce tasty pizza with prices ranging from 49,00 to 59,000 kroner. They also have a large selection of other typical grill dishes.

On one of the evenings:

Experience Faaborg on a tour through the streets in the evening with one of the town's night watchmen. It starts from Faaborg Clocktower at 21.00.

Five days on the islands around south Funen

Day 1

Helnæs is an incredible, fascinating half-island to visit. There have been people on Helnæs since the Stone Age. Five burial mounds stand strikingly in the landscape of the hills south of Maden. Helnæs is first mentioned in 1231 as Hælghænæs, which means "the holy nose." When you drive down the narrow causeway out to Helnæs, you encounter a remarkable landscape. Special places to see are Helnæs Kro, the beach, the lighthouse, the antique shop, Bobakkerne and Maden.

Day 2

Hjortø with its nine hectares and approximately 15 residents is one of the smallest inhabited islands in Denmark. These residents live by farming and fishing. Hjortø is reached by ferry from Svendborg, which sails twice daily - maximum 12 passengers per journey. The voyage through the beautiful Svendborg Sound takes 1 hour and is an experience in itself. Hjortø is a car free island and has neither a grocer, inn nor church. It is however rich in natural experiences. Furthermore it is well known for its child friendly beaches.

Day 3

Bjørnø is one of the smallest islands in the south Funen archipelago. You can stroll round its coastline in a couple of hours. The trip offers flat tidal meadows with birdlife and high cliffs and beautiful views of the mainland. There are hedges and stonewalls and in the little village, and beautiful old half-timbered courtyards. A vast number of ducks and other waterfowl breed on the tidal reaches and also in the marsh in the middle of the island. It takes just half an hour to travel there by ferry but you can't take your vehicle. Ferries from Faaborg to Bjørnø sail several times daily, the last from Bjørnø to Faaborg is at 18.00 on weekdays, 15.10 on Saturdays and 18.15 on Sundays.

Day 4

The biggest attraction on Ærø is the landscape itself. The combination of gentle beaches set against the south Funen archipelago and the more wild and rugged stretches of coast on

the Baltic, together with rolling hills, reclaimed coves and the impressive flora are entirely unique. Take the car with you or make it a cycling tour. The last ferry sails from Ærø at 15.25 on weekdays and Saturdays and at 16.30 on Sundays.

Day 5

A day on two islands Lyø and Avernakø. Avernakø lies in the south Funen archipelago. The island is very long and was originally two islands, Avernakø and Korshavn. A causeway now joins them. Ferries that sail to Avernakø also serve Lyø. They sail from Faaborg harbour the direct trip takes 30 minutes. To Lyø the journey lasts 1 hour 10 minutes. You may take your vehicle on board. The ferry operates throughout the day and the last sailing from Avernakø leaves at 21.00.

Five days' cycling around south Funen

Day 1

A long cycle trip of about 40 kilometres. Start from the courtyard, go down Hornegyden to Falsled. Take the road numbered 65 through a very wooded hill and past Søbosø. By the lake ride towards Vester Hæsinge and on to Trente Mølle, Ny Stenderup and further on to Svanninge Bakker, through Svanninge itself to Grubbe Mølle and then back along Horne Landevej.

Day 2

Around Sinebjerg. A trip of roughly 15 kilometres. Start from Lundsgaard goes past the church and take the road to Dyreborg. Travel through Bjerne village up the hill and turn left to Dyreborg through the woods and past the harbour. You could make a detour to Knold. After, ride on to Sinebjerg beach and follow the gravel road for 2 to 3 kilometres and turn towards Horne again. If you want a trip that's a little longer instead of Horne you can go to Vænget down past the Kaprifolie house and down to the water.

Day 3

A trip through Diernæs Gærup Wood and Svanninge Bakker that is approximately 30 kilometres long. From the courtyard ride through Bjerne and take the left turn, following the road all the way to Faaborg. At the roundabout intersection of Svendborgvej and Sundvej take the road to Diernæs and follow route 51 through Alléskoven, Gammel Dyrehave, Gærup Skov. When you come out at the Korinth junction travel a little to the right before you turn onto the other side of the road through Gærup and Knagelbjerg Skov and Svanninge Bakker. The ride back is described in Day 1's trip.

Day 4

One of the shorter trips of about 10 to 15 kilometres. Ride from the courtyard towards Bøjden and just before the ferry terminal turn to the left along the side of Bøjden Nor. Follow the road round through Hornenæs Wood, there are lots of small places to stop at and little detours on the way to different beaches. On the way back you can make the trip a little longer if you ride through the fields and return through Tåstebjerg on the gravel road.

Day 5

A trip through Falsled and Håstrup of about 25 kilometres. Start from the courtyard, go down Hornegyden to Falsled, through Damsbo Wood, turn to the right to Håstrup and to the right again through Hanneslund along route 60 down to Millinge out and past Grubbe Mølle and back to Lundsgaard.

If you would like to have a longer trip we can recommend this. About 74 kilometres. Start from the courtyard, go down Hornegyden to Falsled. The route is number 65 and takes you to Brobyværk through a wooded hill and past Søbosø. At Brobyværk turn off route 65 towards Ringe. The trip from Ringe and back to Lundsgaard follows route 51 which takes you past Brahetrolleborg, through Gærup Wood.

Five days' walking around south Funen

Day 1

A little walk of just 5 kilometres. This is down to the beach at Tornæs Hoved / Horne Krogen, going down Strandvej just off Hornelandevej.

Day 2

A little longer walk of about 10 kilometres. Drive to Korinth. At Spanget turn to the right where the car can be parked. Walk around Norresø, a very beautiful walk through the wood.

Day 3

Drive up to Svanninge Bakker or Svanninge Bjerge (on either side of Odensesvej). Here there are lots of different walks of different lengths to be made.

Day 4

A walk round Horne Land. This walk can be one of 3, 5, 7, or 9 kilometres. Leave the courtyard and turn right after the church up Kirkeballevvej. Depending on how long you want your walk to be you can turn to the right, but the longer walk will take you down through the protected Gerdsele Wood which is entirely unique, to the beach at Vænget past the Kaprifolie house.

Day 5

Drive to Helnæs travelling through Falsled, Hårby, Snave and the little fishing hamlet of Brunshuse. There are lots of beautiful places for walking on Helnæs.
